The Northern Shuswap Tribal Council (NSTC) office in Williams Lake supports the four NStQ communities of Soda Creek/Deep Creek, Williams Lake, Stswecem'c Xgat'tem and Canim Lake, through the provision of support services and project coordination.

The Position:

We are looking for a Chief Negotiator who will:

- *Work within the mandates of the BC Treaty Process toward an NStQ Final Agreement; involving completion of land, resources and self-government agreements between the NStQ, Provincial and Federal Governments, while remaining consistent with the mandates, policies and vision of the NStQ.*
- *Is seeking an exciting and challenging opportunity, while living and working in a spectacular rural region of BC.*
- *Enjoys travel, engaging with community members, and who wants the satisfaction of making a difference in the lives of NStQ members.*

The Location:
