The Northern Shuswap Treaty Society is seeking “two” qualified candidates to become Urban Regional Liaisons (one each) in Kamloops and Vancouver/Lower Mainland. These creative and exciting liaison positions will serve as an important link between NStQ urban members and the NStQ Governance working group.

Who We Are:

The Northern Shuswap Tribal Council (NSTC) office in Williams Lake supports the four NStQ communities of Soda Creek/Deep Creek, Williams Lake, Stswecem’c Xgat’tem and Canim Lake through the provision of services and project coordination, and represent a combined membership of more than 2,500 members who reside both on, and off reserve.

The Positions:

We are looking for Urban Liaisons who will:

- *Work with, and represent the interests of off-reserve (urban) members; including the set-up of meetings with off-reserve (Urban) members.*
- *Provide information on self-government initiatives and obtain feedback.*
- *Research, identify and record member interests and provide this info to the treaty team, and communicate member concerns to self-governance working group.*
- *Organize and participate in a variety of committee and treaty working group meetings – providing a strong focus in maintaining two-way communications with other Urban Regional Liaisons, treaty team members, NStQ urban members, and developing/providing input and content for newsletters/newspaper.*

We offer a competitive salary. Some travel will be required for this position.
